close to actual (limited) production due to it's phenomenal acceptance at each showing. The C -X75 would go head to head with the Audi R-8 eTron, Mercedes SLS AMG E-cell and the Porsche 918 Spyder Hybrid. Wouldn't that be something to "leap for!"

Other whisperings include a possible "crossover vehicle" for Jaguar based upon the new Range Rover Evoque chassis. A replacement for the AWD X-Type may also appear in 2014

The Membership Survey that was circulated earlier was reviewed at this meeting. The responses are as follows:

Q: What activities would you most enjoy to have offered?

- R: Rally drives: 7, Destination drives: 7, Gymkhana/slalom: 3, Picnics: 6, Gatherings / Parties / Potlucks: 6, Informational meetings about car care/products: 7, Concours: 7, Other: Parades, 2, Wolf Sanctuary, 1.
- S: Would you enjoy Club meetings and attend more often if the meetings were more of a social event, with club business conducted by the board in a separate meeting?
- T: Yes: 6, No: 2 ("Probably not, may attend less")
- U: What night of the week would be most convenient for you to attend a meeting?
- V: Monday: 6, Tuesday: 7, Wednesday: 6, Thursday: 7, Friday: 3, Saturday: 1
- W:("BREAKFAST: Why does it have to be at night, why not breakfast?). Sunday: 1.

X: What was the reason you joined the Club? What experience did you most look forward to?

R: "Socializing with fellow Jag enthusiasts and participating in events."

"To meet other Jaguar owners and do things with them."

"To meet and share mutual interest in Jaguars and other British motor car enthusiasts."

"To meet with other Jag owners and participate in activities."

"Main reason for joining was for resources in restoring my old Jag. Concours and riving are second with the social aspect third."

"Socialize with people who own and/or love Jaguars."

"Thom paid for our first years membership because we bought a new Jag from him, so I

really didn't know what I was getting into. I attended a couple of meetings and discovered a great group of people so I kept coming back and now you can't get rid of me. I look forward to just about all of it. The Concours is fun, the social events are fun, the driving events are fun. It is all a good time for me, but, hey, I love cars and am a car guy."

"First year membership came with my Jaguar purchase. I was curious about what the Club would be like and I liked what I found - as they say, the rest is history."

Q: Do you think the club dues (\$50. a year) are fair for what you get?

R: Yes, 8 ("Absolutely") No, 0.

Q: What would make the club better or more enjoyable for you?

R: "If we had more participate."

"A different meeting place more suited to socializing and some competitive driving events."

"More participants and more driving activities."

"Would it be possible to provide a membership roster with type of car and contact info that would only be available to members?"

"More people in the club who participate in activities and events."

"I wish I had a silver bullet on how to get people into the club and enjoying the club but I don't. Maybe we need to revisit what we think has worked and then make those things even better. Are we trying to do too much as a club? Not really sure what the right answer is. Sorry I don't have any ground breaking ideas."

"I suppose if we held "business" meetings less often and interspersed them with "social" meeting, it would be less work for the board members. However, I like it fine the way it is."

"I do like the museum and car collection tours a lot. Maybe inviting other car clubs to our events or joining other clubs for their events might increase the "interest" in our club. Either way, it might provide more events to participate in."

Additional Comments:

"If we had the meetings on a Saturday morning it would be a natural progression to move

from breakfast to a follow-on club event (rally/destination/slalom/etc) for those who wanted to participate."

"During the summer there might be some merit in coordinating the day / time with that *First Saturdays* club that puts on the shows over at First & Main Town Center (Powers & N. Carefree) in front of Dick's Sporting Goods. We might get more participation on the driving events from other clubs.

Or, we could try and set up something similar at the new shopping center on North Nevada. I think it's called University Village. There is plenty of open parking lot available plus there is a Panera Bread eatery there. I would be willing to make some contacts and see what level of support I could get from the property owners there. We could start the *Last Saturday Club*."

We should try separating out the board meetings and have a quarterly dinner at a restaurant or something like that. Another idea may be to meet once a month for breakfast on a Saturday morning. Maybe that is easier than dinner. Don't know, just a thought."

"I feel that the Club functions pretty well as it is. I know we will have to at least maintain the size of the club, but the size is pretty manageable now. I think if we had more involvement from current inactive members, it would help a lot. I suspect "too big" won't ever really be an issue."

"I don't think you could ask for a better group of club members than we have right now. All the active members get along really well and everyone works hard at making the club a big success. I think Thom provides the "glue" that really keeps the club interesting and operating smoothly. I sure hope we can keep him involved!!"



The XKExperience will be held from March 26 -27, 2011 and is expected to be the largest gathering of E-types for the anniversary on the East Coast. This is an event not to be missed and will be held in conjunction with the JCNA 2011 AGM, in Richmond, VA.

Norman Dewis, famed Jaguar driver and development engineer of the E-type and of many other track and road Jaguars of the fifties and sixties will be our VIP guest speaker and will be available for meet and greet and book signing opportunities during the event.
